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Reminder regarding "Anaphylaxis Action Plans"

These need to be updated by your Doctor or at your annual consultant date. Please ensure your child's updated Epi-pens and action plans are provided to the office as a matter of urgency. For students with Asthma, please ensure we have an updated action plan and Ventolin that is in date, as some inhalers may expire during the year. For those students which have allergies and require an anti-histamine, please ensure you provide these to the office.

Permission Notes

When returning permission notes for school activities it is a legal requirement to return a **SEPARATE** permission note for each child. If you pay online it is still necessary to return the permission note to the office. In addition, if returning multiple notes for more than one child/activity, there is no need to put each note into a separate envelope. We are able to process multiple payments for multiple activities/children in the one transaction Please ensure your child/s full name and class are on the permission note.

For P&C events such as fun food, uniform shop, school caps etc... please do not pay online through the school website.

High Expectations for Attendance – A resource for schools

When school communities have high expectations of their students, they achieve greater outcomes. High expectations is: creating a place where students want to be, parents/ carers are happy to send them, and teachers/staff have a desire to excel. High expectations for attendance are: a 95% attendance rate, which is 10 days or less absences a year.

Timeframe for use

The appropriate time to use this resource may differ for each school, leader and teacher.

Intended audience

This resource can be used by school leadership teams to promote a consistent understanding of high expectations for attendance.

Instructions for use

What does high expectations for attendance look like, feel like and sound like? This resource can be used by leadership teams and staff to identify strategies already in operation at the school, and to explore new ideas to achieve high expectations for attendance. 


